HOLY COMMUNION

In the Orthodox Church, the sacrament of Communion is offered only to Orthodox Christians who have prepared to receive. Non-Orthodox believers and others **may approach the chalice for a blessing and the blessed bread instead of the Eucharist.** So that the priest is aware of this, please just say, *"Father, bless" when you get to the chalice.*

At the conclusion of Matins, we sing the Great Doxology followed by the Matins Dismissal Troparion

GREAT LITANY

FIRST ANTIPHON—Psalm verses with refrain

Vs. It is good to give praise unto the Lord, and to chant unto Thy name, O Most High; To proclaim Thy mercy in the morning, and Thy truth by night. [Refrain]

Refrain: Through the intercessions of the Theotokos, O Savior, save us.

- Vs. Upright is the Lord our God, and there is no unrighteousness in Him. [Refrain]
- Vs. Glory...now & ever...Amen. [Refrain]

Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness sake, for theirs is the kingdom of Heaven. Blessed are you when men shall revile you and shall persecute you, and shall say all manner of evil against you falsely for my sake. Rejoice and be exceedingly glad, for great is your reward in heaven.

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Beloved parents of the younger parishioners of St. Athanasius,

I would like to address an issue regarding the safety and supervision of all the children of our parish. The Members of this parish are our spiritual family from the youngest newborn to our oldest brothers and sisters, and we are struggling for salvation and to grow together toward Jesus Christ *in wisdom and in stature*. Together as a spiritual family we can work together to keep and maintain a safe, peaceful, and spiritually thriving community where this can continue to occur.

We also need to keep in mind that our campus is open, and we frequently have visitors that we know very little about. This involves our vigilance in knowing where our children are and what they are doing while at St. Athanasius.

Thank God, He has preserved us in my years here from any untoward or dangerous situations that have led to evil ends regarding our children's safety while at our parish and our community events. However, we need more attention and help as a spiritual family from you parents to make this situation better and safer and to preserve the peace and harmony of our parish community.

There have been times when a child has needed to be parented and their parents or the person in charge of them could not be be found nearby. Please parents, follow this general rule of child supervision when you are on our parish campus.

No child should be sent or allowed to go into a different part of the building or a section of our campus where a parent or a person in charge is not present. All children 12 years old and under need to be within the hearing or sight of their parents or a designated person in charge. The only exception is when your children are under the supervision of one of the Catechists or the Youth Church School Teacher during the lesson, or with the Youth Group Leader at a youth event. In all circumstances, children must remain with their parents in the Nave of the Church during the services or with their family at a parish event. A parent must accompany their child in the other areas of our campus when they need a bathroom or a 'get the wiggles out' break. If a child is found somewhere without their parents, we will help them find you.

Lastly, some kids have wanted to help with the Agape Meal. Glory to God! We want to encourage this desire to serve, so from now on children who desire to help the Agape Meal Team may do so <u>only when working alongside their parent and under their supervision if the</u> <u>Agape Meal Team leader for that week gives their permission</u> for this addition to the team, as this set up must be done quickly and carefully.</u>

May we each grow together in the peace and wisdom of Christ in this spiritual family.
