THE GREAT LITANY

FIRST ANTIPHON—Psalm verses with refrain

Vs. It is good to give praise unto the Lord, and to chant unto Thy name, O Most High; To proclaim Thy mercy in the morning, and Thy truth by night. [Refrain]

Refrain: Through the intercessions of the Theotokos, O Savior, save us.

- Vs. Upright is the Lord our God, and there is no unrighteousness in Him. [Refrain]
- Vs. Glory...now & ever...Amen. [Refrain]

SECOND ANTIPHON—Psalm verses with refrain

Vs. The Lord is King, He is clothed with majesty; the Lord is clothed with strength and hath girded Himself.

Refrain: O Son Of God Who rose from the dead, save us who sing to Thee, Alleluia!

- Vs. For He hath established the world which shall not be shaken. [Refrain]
- Vs. Holiness befits Thy house, O Lord, forevermore. [Refrain]

Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness sake,

for theirs is the kingdom of Heaven.

Blessed are you when men shall revile you and shall persecute you, and shall say all manner of evil against you falsely for my sake.

Rejoice and be exceedingly glad, for great is your reward in heaven.

SAFETY PROTOCOLS UPDATE

Metropolitan Joseph has given us a blessing to continue to do our services inside the nave. The Parish Council asks the members of the parish to adhere to the following:

- During services, please maintain at least 6 ft. of distance on all sides, including in the Communion line, and wear a mask that covers both YOUR MOUTH AND NOSE. (Families may sit together but should have six feet of space in front and behind them.
- The Sunday Divine Liturgy is being broadcast in the hallway and on the patio for overflow crowd and for those who are not comfortable sitting inside the nave.
- There will be no COFFEE HOUR for now. Please do not linger inside the building after the services unless you are buying something from the Bookstore.

Because of the kindness and generosity of remarkable people like you, Showers of Blessing Santa Barbara has been able to provide compassionate services for the most

vulnerable and fragile individuals in our community.

Site Coordinator Wade Volk Our extraordinary staff and dedicated volunteers have been doing this one day at a time for over six years and continue to provide the Showers program during this pandemic. Of course, we take great care in making certain our guests, staff, and volunteers wear masks and all necessary protective gear to create a safe and welcoming environment. And through it all, they give with extraordinary kindness.

What does it cost Showers of Blessing in a year to provide one site for our houseless guests? \$40,000. Multiply that by five sites and it costs \$200,000 a year. This cost includes Showers' staff, soap, sanitizers, toiletries, underwear, socks, bottles of water, vehicle maintenance, and fuel, but does not include administrative salaries.
