

At the conclusion of Matins, we sing the Great Doxology followed by the Matins Dismissal Troparion:

THE DIVINE LITURGY OF ST. JOHN CHRYSOSTOM

GREAT LITANY

FIRST ANTIPHON verses for the Feast of the Cross with refrain:

Vs. O God, my God, attend to me; why hast Thou forsaken me? Far from my salvation are the words of my transgressions.

Refrain: Through the intercessions of the Theotokos, O Savior, save us.

- Vs. My God, I will cry by day, and wilt Thou not hearken? But as for Thee, Thou dwellest in the sanctuary, O Praise of Israel. [Refrain]
- Vs. Glory...now & ever...Amen. [Refrain]

SECOND ANTIPHON verses for the Feast of the Cross & refrain

Vs. O God, why hast Thou cast us off unto the end? Remember Thy congregation which Thou hast purchased from the beginning.

Refrain: O Son Of God Who rose from the dead, save us who sing to Thee, Alleluia!

- Vs. This is Mount Zion wherein Thou hast dwelt. [Refrain]
- Vs. God is our King before the ages, He hath wrought salvation in the midst of the earth. [Refrain]

Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit; Now and ever and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Only Begotten Son and immortal Word of God who for our salvation didst will to be incarnate of the holy Theotokos and ever virgin Mary, who without change didst become man and wast crucified, O Christ our God, trampling down death by death, who art one of the Holy Trinity, glorified with the Father and the Holy Spirit: save us!

THIRD ANTIPHON and verses for the Feast of the Cross

Vs. The Lord is king, let the peoples rage; He sitteth on the Cherubim, let the earth be shaken.

Refrain: Troparion for the Feast of the Cross

O Lord save Thy people and bless Thine inheritance, granting victory over all adversaries. And by the pow'r of Thy cross protect us.

- Vs. The Lord is great in Zion, and He is high above all peoples.
- Vs. Let them confess Thy great Name, for it is terrible and holy.

Troparion of the Resurrection (Music on page 45 of Liturgy book)

Tone 4

Having learned the joyful message of the Resurrection from the angel, the women disciples of the Lord cast from them their parental condemnation, and proudly broke the news to the disciples saying death has been spoiled.

Christ God is risen, granting the world great mercy.

Troparion for the Feast of the Elevation of the Holy Cross

Tone 1

O Lord save Thy people and bless Thine inheritance, granting victory over all adversaries. And by the pow'r of Thy cross protect us.

Troparion to St. Athanasius

Tone 3

Holy Bishop Athanasius, you became a stronghold of Orthodoxy, strengthening the Church through your divine teachings. Opposing the heretical opinion of Arius, you explained and taught that the Son is equal in nature with the Father. O holy Father, intercede with Christ God that He may grant us abundant mercy.

Kontakion for the Feast of the Cross

Tone 4

As You were voluntarily raised upon the <u>Cross</u> for our sake, grant mercy to those who are called by Your Name, O <u>Christ</u> God; make all Orthodox Christians glad by your <u>power</u>, granting them victories over their <u>adversaries//</u> by bestowing on them the invincible trophy, Your weapon of peace!

Holy God, Holy Mighty, Holy Immortal, have mercy on us.

+Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Holy Immortal have mercy on us.

Deacon: With strength!

People: Holy God, Holy Mighty, Holy Immortal, have mercy on us.

Preparatory Psalm verses before the Epistle (Prokeimenon) (Music on page 59 of Liturgy book)

Tone 4

O Lord, how manifold are Thy works, in wisdom Thou hast made them all. (Ps 103/104:24)

Vs. Bless the Lord O my soul, O Lord my God, Thou art very great.

EPISTLE READING Galatians. (2:16-20)

Brethren, you know that a man is not justified by works of the law but through faith in Jesus Christ. Even we have believed in Christ Jesus, in order to be justified by faith in Christ, and not by works of the law, because by works of the law shall no one be justified. But if, in our endeavor to be justified in Christ, we ourselves were found to be sinners, is Christ then an agent of sin? Certainly not! But if I build up again those things which I tore down, then I prove myself a transgressor. For I through the Law died to the Law, that I might live to God. I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ Who lives in me; and the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, Who loved me and gave Himself for me.

The Lord said, "If any man would come after Me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow Me. For whoever would save his life will lose it; and whoever loses his life for My sake and the Gospel's will save it. For what does it profit a man, to gain the whole world and forfeit his soul? For what can a man give in return for his soul? For whoever is ashamed of Me and of My words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of him will the Son of man also be ashamed, when He comes in the glory of His Father with the holy angels." And He said to them, "Truly, I say to you, there are some standing here who will not taste death before they see the Kingdom of God come with power."

Meglynarion (Hymn to the Mother of God) for the Feast of the Cross)

Thou art the mystical paradise, O Theotokos, in which blossomed Christ. Through Him, the life-bearing wood of the Cross was planted upon earth. Now, at its elevation, as we bow down before it, we magnify Thee.

HOLY COMMUNION

In the Orthodox Church, the sacrament of Communion is offered only to Christians who are baptized in the name of the Trinity and chrismated into the Orthodox Faith. Non-Orthodox believers **may approach the chalice for a blessing and the blessed bread instead of the Eucharist.** So that the priest is aware of this, please just say,

"Father, bless" when you get to the chalice.

Thanksgiving Prayers after Communion

At the end of the Divine Liturgy, we offer the prayers of thanksgiving for having received the Body and Blood of Christ. These beautiful prayers help us to reflect on the mystery in which we have just partaken, and prepare us for our transition back into the "world." We invite you to listen to these beautiful prayers during and after the veneration of the cross at the end of the service, and ask that you show courtesy to those who are remaining to hear the prayers in their entirety by waiting until Coffee Hour to socialize.



Peaceful, prayerful, effective 40 Days for Life campaign kicks off with September 22 rally

(Santa Barbara) (CA) – "We truly pray that this 40 Days for Life campaign will mark the beginning of the end of abortion in Santa Barbara," said Lisa Sloan, who coordinates the local effort. "We will start our campaign with a rally at 518 Garden St. in Santa Barbara on September 22 at 6pm."

Santa Barbara is one of a thousand cities from coast to coast conducting simultaneous 40 Days for Life campaigns from September 22 to October 31. "We start this effort by drawing members of the community together to share the vision of 40 Days for Life and to pray for God's blessings on this effort. It is time to focus attention on the harm abortion has done to our city," said Sloan.

Local community leaders will speak on the importance of protecting life at the 40 Days for Life kickoff event, including a pastor and a practicing physician. The event will include worship and prayer.

"This will mark the start of 40 days of prayer and fasting, with special attention to prayer in the public right-of-way outside the abortion facility at Planned Parenthood, 518 Garden St., Santa Barbara, as well as various types of community outreach. We look forward to seeing what kind of transformation God will bring about in our city," said Sloan.

All prayer vigil participants are asked to sign a statement of peace, pledging to conduct themselves in a Christ-like manner at all times.

40 Days for Life is a peaceful, intensive campaign that focuses on 40 days of prayer and fasting, 40 days of peaceful vigil at abortion facilities, and 40 days of grassroots educational outreach. The 40-day time frame is drawn from examples throughout Biblical history where God brought about world-changing transformation in 40-day periods.
